Letter from Pastor Tan Hock Seng

Carry On

"...however, let us keep living by that same standard to which we have attained." - Philippians 3:16

At The Hiding Place, we see many of our residents' lives transformed by the power of God. This transformation is amazing to see, but the next challenge for them would be to "keep living by that same standard to which (they) have attained", as written in Philippians 3:16.

Within the safety net of The Hiding Place, walking on the right path is easier with the support of the staff and fellow residents. But no matter how much we, as the staff, do to keep our residents on the right path, we can only do so much. There will come a point where the residents themselves would have to put forth the effort and take the wheel in order to keep living by the same standard they have attained.

In order to do this, they (as well as all of us) have to learn to set goals and be disciplined to reach their goals. Having goals is what makes life interesting and helps keep us on track in our walk with God. Without clear goals, life would be monotonous at best, and wayward at worst.

Additionally, the process of changing oneself needs to be an ongoing process and not a one-time effort. We need to continuously chip away at the bad habits we have learnt and make effort to form new ones - all the while keeping in mind that our heart is always finding ways to deceive ourselves (Jeremiah 17:9).

Resident's Testimony - Sebestian

My name is Sebestian and I am 23. I come from a low-income family and our family of eight - my grandparents, my parents and three younger siblings - live together. I was born in Indonesia and I came to Singapore when I was four years old.

I completed my ITE course in electrical engineering in 2019 and enlisted for NS after that. I didn't do well enough to go into Poly. In 2020, ICA informed me to do my oath-taking to complete my citizenship process but I did not take it seriously and did not follow up on it. I was made to surrender my birth cert and IC in 2021. My NS was cut short because I was no longer considered a Singapore citizen.

When I was still in NS, I tried borrowing \$6000 from an illegal moneylender to learn driving and to help with family expenses. I was scammed and did not get the money but I was forced to pay it back. I had no choice but to work for the loanshark - splashing paint and vandalising cars. I was arrested by the police after being on the job for three days.

I was brought to the Hiding Place while awaiting my sentencing. I wanted to leave because of the many rules and regulations in the home. My family convinced me to stay so that I could keep away from bad company. Over time, I was touched by the care and encouragement from the staff and residents and I decided to come back after my release.

In Feb this year, I was charged for loanshark activities. I spent 6 months in prison and was given 3 strokes of the cane. As I was no longer a citizen, I was informed by ICA that I would be deported to Indonesia after my incarceration. I was very worried because I was stateless, where would I end up?

A church friend helped me engage a lawyer. My family and friends, including people at the Hiding Place, prayed for me. Praise God I did not get deported after my release and I came back to Hiding Place. I was informed in early Sep that I would be able to get back my Singapore citizenship. Hallelujah!

I really thank God for His love for me. He is a God of second chances and He answers prayers. I am grateful to everyone who helped and prayed for me.
