I continue to be encouraged by the lives of those who live with me here – many of whom were residents together with me a decade ago, but are now full-time staff and board members of HP. I aspire to follow their example in living out Ephesians 4:28 - Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need.

Forgiveness Before Deliverance

“Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.” - Eph 4:32 NIV

It is important that we learn to accept God’s forgiveness and extend that forgiveness to others. I have seen Christians having problems forgiving themselves and others. We all make mistakes, but for some reason, we have problems forgiving others. Forgiveness is not natural; it is a supernatural action.

Hurts that we experience from those we love the most, like our family, friends and neighbours can really affect us. We may find it hard to forgive because our pride is wounded. In serious offences such as violent crimes, divorce and slander, the roadblock to forgiveness is our natural desire for revenge. When we are hurt, we want to hurt back. We are all capable of being very angry towards others. We may also fear that our act of forgiveness will be misunderstood. In society, a forgiving person may be viewed as weak. Society may also say that certain people do not deserve forgiveness.

Saying “let’s forget about it” is not forgiveness. That would be like burying the problem by blocking it out of the mind. The relief would only be temporary. On the other hand, true forgiveness honestly says, “Yes! You have wronged me. I am hurt, but I will not allow that hurt to control me. By an act of my will, I will see you as God does - an imperfect person in need of forgiveness and love.”

Christ forgives us this way. He does not agree with our wrongs. He does not pat us on our backs and say our sin is fine and ok. When He forgives, He says, “Go, and sin no more.” (John 8:11) We must have a tough skin (that is not easily hurt) and a soft heart (that always extends God’s love to others).

Resident's Testimony - Frederick Law

I was born 29 years ago to Christian parents. My father was a pastor and a missionary. Although I grew up with as much Scripture as any young mind could handle, I never truly understood or experienced who God was until much later in my life.

At 15 years of age, I was tired of being a social outcast in school due to my strict parents. I started smoking, drinking and fighting. Within a few months, my attendance in school went from 100% to 0%. Eventually I ran away from home to stay with friends. I began to steal from convenience stores almost every day. I eventually got arrested for the first time for theft when I was 16.

When I turned 17, a friend introduced me to ketamine, and then subsequently, meth and ecstasy. It was not long before I got caught for drug-related charges. I was sentenced to two years supervised probation at the Hiding Place (HP). HP opened my eyes for the first time to the way God was working in my life and the lives of those around me. I experienced reconciliation with my family. God also blessed me with committed tutors who sacrificed their time and effort to enable me to achieve an 'O' Levels aggregate of nine points.

When I was 19, I completed my probation and left HP to begin studying for my diploma at a polytechnic. Although I stayed drug-free, I gradually stopped going to church and reading the bible. During my final year in polytechnic, my girlfriend of two years left me. I slid into depression, and one of my friends offered me drugs to cheer me up. From that point, I got sucked even deeper into drugs, and I spent the next few years giving myself up 'to sensuality, greedy to practice every kind of impurity,' as Paul aptly describes in Eph 4:19.

I eventually stopped substance abuse again at 24, when I found a girlfriend with whom I had a three-year relationship. However, after the relationship went south, I picked up right from where I had left off and soon found myself in more trouble than ever before. Within the span of a few months, I did so much wrong under the influence of drugs which I deeply regret. I had also accumulated a mountain of debt which caused considerable stress for my family.

At my wits end, I contacted a staff member of HP to ask if they were willing to
