## Staff Testimony - Alvin Chow

As a child, I never liked staying at home. There were always arguments happening and I had difficulties in communicating with my family members. I started to hang out with bad company and eventually ended up in prison under the Criminal Law Detention at the aged of 17 for gang-related activities. It was during my time in prison that I first heard about Jesus Christ and I accepted Christ into my life, although I did not really understand His ways.

When I was released from prison, very quickly I went back to my old ways again and eventually got hooked on drugs. Drugs not only brought harm to me, but also brought grief to my family members. Drugs caused them to lose hope in me. They mostly ignored me at home. I felt very withdrawn, very lonely, very bitter.

One of the most heart-warming moments I experienced as an addict was when I hadn't eaten for a few days and my mother came to me in a soft voice telling me that she had cooked porridge for me. I felt so touched, because we seldom talked and I thought she had already given up on me. I felt a sense of guilt within me when I looked at her. At that moment, I made a decision to quit drugs.

I tried quitting. I found myself getting even more hooked, the more I tried to quit. I felt helpless at this point, asking myself if I was going to be like that for the rest of my life. "What am I going to do?" In this time of distress, I cried out to God for help. "Oh God, please help me, for I am unable to help myself!"

Through God's mercy and grace, He led me to a pastor who brought me to church. One day as I was reading the Bible, I came across a verse in Mark 9:23 - "Everything is possible for him who believes." As I pondered on it, I heard a voice in my heart say "You can," and my tears just flowed down. All along I thought I couldn't quit drugs, now I realised that in Christ I can have hope.

On Sep 21, 2011, the pastor whom I met brought me to enrol in the Hiding Place residential programme. He was one of the regular devotional speakers in
