The key thing that I learn coming back to Hiding Place for the second time is to cherish my family and to have a new mind-set to go after things that last and not things that are temporary. I need God, I cannot walk alone. Lastly, I am very thankful to God that The Hiding Place took me in again. I also want to thank my earthly father for not giving up on me although I have disappointed him so much.

Pray for JJ to press on and persevere in his walk with Jesus and his desire to change.

# Letter from Pastor Tan Hock Seng Mirror, Mirror on the Wall...

Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror and after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like.

James 1:23-24

In a spiritual context, God's word is a mirror. There is another functionally similar parallel: People can also mirror or reflect back our inner selves, forcing us to confront aspects of ourselves that we may not be fully aware of or willing to acknowledge, including our strengths, weaknesses, past traumas, and vulnerabilities.

Amos 5:19 (NIV) states, "It will be as though a man fled from a lion only to meet a bear, as though he entered his house and rested his hand on the wall only to have a snake bite him." We are just like that house described – our "inner world" or "lands of the mind" – and there are enemies in the land of the mind we have not conquered. Seeing our own reflection in others through their actions, words, and even their presence can reveal or trigger parts of our own inner landscape, both positive and negative. When such moments occur, they are often highly intense and charged as they force us to confront our own issues and vulnerabilities.

These reflections in the mirror may bring up painful emotions or unresolved issues. However, they can also facilitate personal growth and healing if we respond correctly. If we do not learn to consciously surrender these enemies of our mind to the Lord, we will come up against them continuously and keep experiencing defeat in those areas. Let us learn to trust God to use these mirror struggles to mould our character in His mercy and love.

# Resident's Testimony: Ang Jun Jie (JJ)

I am 23 years old this year. I started gambling when I was 14, whenever I had the money. Two years ago, I got hooked on drinking and vaping at KTVs, at least 3 to 4 times a week. Back then, I only worked part-time so my money was limited. I started gambling in the hope of getting more money to feed my addiction. I borrowed and stole from my parents and when it was not enough, I borrowed from loan sharks. When I couldn't pay my debts, I had no choice but to tell my parents and they helped me clear my debts. The cycle repeated more then 7 times within the two years.

Everyone gave up on me except my father. He suggested that I come to The Hiding Place for the one-year programme. I had no choice but to come unwillingly. I made up my mind to stay only for one to two months. Unexpectedly, a Bible teacher led me to receive Christ in the first month of my stay. But sadly, the 'old man' was still very much alive in me, I still only thought about myself and wanting to leave this place. So I left, thinking I was okay already.

I backslided less than two months after leaving and owed about \$19,000. This was when I knew I could not continue with this lifestyle. It was affecting my relationship with my family and causing a lot of pain and suffering. Because of my selfishness and addictions, I really disappointed my family especially my father. He is normally a hot-tempered person but my waywardness caused him to go numb. He stopped scolding me but he still cared for me. For this one reason, I realised that I really need to change and also give myself a chance to live a proper life.

I immediately called one of the HP staff and asked if I could come back for the programme. I am thankful I was given a second chance. I told myself that this time round, I must really change for the better. No matter how tough the stay, I must pray and press on.

I have been at The Hiding Place for about three months now and I have learnt that Jesus is always with me, no matter how bad a person I am, as long as I am willing to change and follow him. My father's love for me helps me to understand Jesus' love. No matter how many times I have disappointed him, he still loves and cares about me. Hebrews 11: 6 says, "And without faith it is
